## Usually you will take the following steps to find a job:



Find an open position



Fill out an application and submit it



Wait for contact or follow up with the employer



Wait for contact or follow up with the employer



Continue to look for open positions.

## Most refugees start in entry-level positions:



Each position should allow you to better your English, gain U.S. work experience and recommendations, and learn new skills. Some jobs offer healthcare and other benefits. Most refugees work in a new field because of their lack of work experience in the United States, and perhaps because of their lower level English. Your first job is most likely not your last in the United States.
